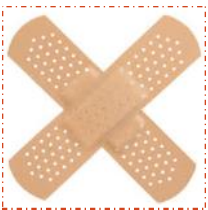
*Dear Mission Partners,*

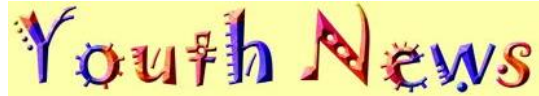
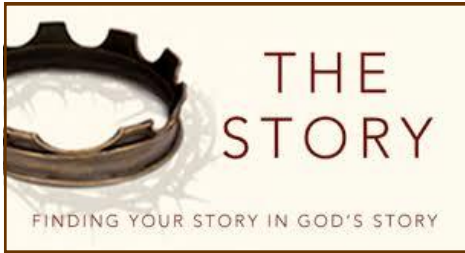


**Band aids needed for El Salvador - please bring to church

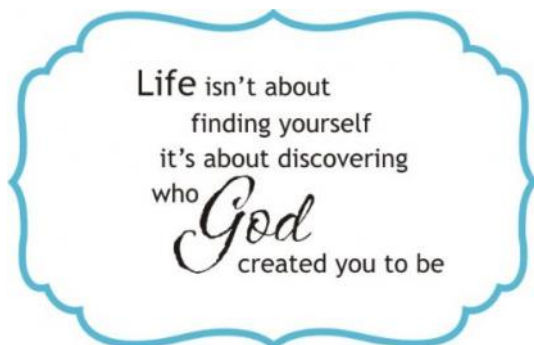

# Mission Highlight for October

## What is Project Move?

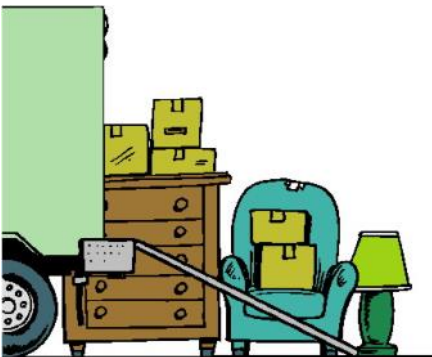


Hope Center's Project Move was re-instituted in June of 2010. We take in donated appliances, furniture and other household items for people that are relocating from a shelter or a family residence. These basic items are critical to the next step into independence and self-reliance. Hope Center takes in donated items and then delivers them to those in need.

Homelessness sometimes is not about a roof over one's head so much as it can be about having a bed instead of an air mattress, a refrigerator instead of an ice chest, or a sofa instead of a lawn chair. It sometimes is about creating a sense of hominess. Over 580 individuals have been served through this program in 2011.

Our guests will come in for an interview with our Project Move Coordinator. It is at this time that they request the furniture that they need. We then put them on the waiting list for that item. On the other side of it, our donors call Hope Center letting us know that they have furniture they would like to donate. The Coordinator then sets up a pick-up of the donated furniture and similarly schedules (from our waiting list) a drop-off of the donated furniture to our guests in need. Donors will receive a receipt of item(s) at time of pick up.

***The main items we pick up and deliver are: beds, dressers, couches, kitchen tables/chairs, end/coffee tables, living room chairs, lamps, refrigerators, stoves, and washers/dryers.***



### Year-to-date at Hope Center

#### Project Move:

630 households received 1,684 household items.

360 households received 1,116 furniture items.

71 layettes were distributed.

#### Donations:

914 Furniture items donated.

5,166 Household items donated.
