

Weather permitting, we will be outside for Drive-In worship with a baptism. In case of inclement weather, worship will be livestream only.




**What does forgiveness mean to you?**

- ♥ baby wipes



Stop by the slat wall in the main hallway, or get your copy from our Little Free Library. Take a copy to give to a friend!




**Looking for a good book to read?**

Our SCRIP program continues to be the primary source of FREE money that the Human Concerns Team uses to support charitable causes in our local,

national and global communities. You buy SCRIP cards at face value and we get rebates from retailers. There are **hundreds** of cards available. We have many on hand and they can be purchased any time we have Drive-In worship in the parking lot. They can also be purchased by calling/emailing Barb Deichl, our Scrip coordinator. Call Barb at 262-968-9494 (home) or 262 893-8616 (cell), or email her at bldras@wi.rr.com. Other cards can be ordered and we generally have those cards within a week.

### CONSIDER:

- ⊙ **School supply shopping:** We have Office Depot, Target and Walmart.
- ⊙ **School clothes shopping:** We have Kohl's, TJMaxx, Target, Walmart. We can order LOTS of retail clothing store cards such as Old Navy, Banana Republic, Maurice's, Land's End, LL Bean.
- ⊙ **Fall project shopping:** We have Home Depot, Menard's, Lowe's.
- ⊙ **Grocery shopping:** Meijer's, Pick & Save, Sendik's.
- ⊙ **Gas:** We have Kwik Trip, Shell, BP.
- ⊙ **Travel:** Gas cards, motel/hotel cards, restaurant cards.
