Our SCRIP program continues to be the primary source of FREE money that the Human Concerns Team uses to support charitable causes in our local, national and global

communities. You buy SCRIP cards at face value and we get rebates from retailers. There are **hundreds** of cards available. We have many on hand and they can be purchased any time we have Drive-In worship in the parking lot. They can also be purchased by calling/emailing Barb Deichl, our Scrip coordinator. Call Barb at 262-968-9494 (home) or 262 893-8616 (cell), or email her at bldras@wi.rr.com. Other cards can be ordered and we generally have those cards within a week.

CONSIDER:

- Kohl's cards can be used to pay your Kohl's charge

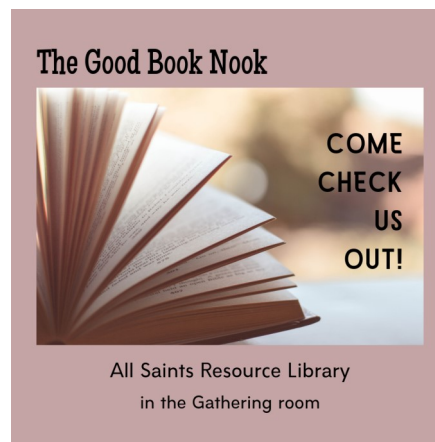
